

# Meaningful Watershed Educational Experience

## **MWEE Ambassador or Practitioner**

MWEE Ambassadors are teachers, district administrators, school staff, or nonformal education partners, among others, who understand the value the Meaningful Watershed Educational Experience can bring to a student's learning experience and advocate for MWEE integration into school curriculum. They are prepared to implement the MWEE framework in their classrooms and/or act as a partner to implement one or more portions of the MWEE.

#### MWEE Ambassadors have....

- Completed MWEE 101 Online Course
- Attended a full 6 hour in-person or hybrid MWEE Ambassador training

Additionally, MWEE Ambassadors/Practitioners are part of a network of networks designed to support the community in bettering practice and adoption of high quality environmental literacy programming.

## **MWEE Facilitator**

MWEE Facilitators are typically nonformal education partners or district administrators who provide the "next level" of training and support for formal and non-formal educators, school system staff, and others on the development and implementation of systemic MWEEs. They have a strong understanding of the MWEE and can direct others to resources to deepen their knowledge, skills, and capacity to deliver MWEEs with full fidelity to the model.

- Become a MWEE Ambassador
- Attended a train-the-trainer workshop using the Facilitator's Guide to MWEE Training
- Have co-facilitated a MWEE Ambassador training series with an experienced MWEE facilitator

- Note: BWET Grantee recipients are encouraged to connect with and co-facilitate their first ambassador training with another experienced MWEE facilitator
- Understand the MWEE framework and help others to understand it
- Have the capacity to train and/or coach others on designing and/or implementing MWEEs
